News has been received here of the death early Monday morning in High point of Mrs. John T. Smith. According to information available, death came to Mrs. Smith unexpectedly. Funeral services Tuesday afternoon at High Point.

Besides her husband, the deceased is survived by two sons, John, Jr., and Edwin. Her mother and several sisters also survive.

The Smiths were residents of this county for several years, moving to High Point from Columbus about four years ago. Mrs. Smith formerly Miss Sara Maud Padgett, was the first Home Demonstration Agent for Polk county and laid the foundation for the present great work being done with the farm women's clubs and 4-H girls. She later taught school in Columbus and was always active in community work.

Mrs. Smith was brought to Polk county through the efforts of the canner club which joined with the State and County in promoting the home demonstration work.
