Rotary-Kiwanis Clubs Have Double Feature

The Tryon Rotary and Kiwanis clubs held a joint meeting on Tuesday at 1 p. m., at Sunnydale to hear John C. Baskervill, head of the division of advertising of the North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development. Another feature of the meeting was the visit and speech of Paul P. Harris, of Chicago, the founder of Rotary International. Harris came to Asheville to participate in Asheville Rotary's 25th anniversary celebration on Monday night and hearing of the joint meeting in Tryon with Kiwanis came here to meet wth the local Rotarians and Kiwanians. Harris stated that he was a close friend of Fred Parker, the Kiwanis International secretary, who also has his headquarters in Chi-The speaker said that all civic clubs had more or less the same ideals of community service and the development of fellowship among the members and that there should be closer cooperation between Kiwanis, Rotary, Lions and othe rorganizations.

Mr. Baskerville, one of the press agents of North Carolina, advertising the resources and attractions of the state, said in his speech that more than \$100,000,000 was spent in North Carolina last year by tourists and visitors from other states.
