Dr. Barker Holds university degrees as doctor of hygiene and physcial culture. While William Howay. Taft was president of Howa. Taft was president of the United State, Dr. Barker spent an hour a day with him, keeping him fit for his job. Then began his lecture work devoted to the young people of the United States and Canada and to their parents.

Millions of high-school students and their mothers and fathers have listened to his addresses on the problems of youth and parent-

Since going on the lecture platform he has delivered over 11,000 addresses.
