Forty-one candidates filed to enter the May 25th primary for the several county offices to be filled in Polk County in the General election this fall.

According to Roy T. Baisden, chairman of the Polk County Board of Elections, the following candidates had paid their filing fees as the books were closed for the primary:

For Representative, James E. Johnson, Carroll P. Rogers and T. J. McDowell, Democrats; George B. Logan, C. Wilbur McGinnis, Geo. C. Dedmond and John M. Shytle, Republicans.
