And still going strong! Polk County's contribution to the War Relief Fund reached a total this morning of \$762.66 with gifts coming in steadily. Of this amount \$16 came from the Tryon Country Day School and \$8.66 from the Tryon Public School, making a total received to date for the Children's Fund of \$24.66. The hope of the Polk County Chapter is to send in \$1,000 and more. In fact we should double our quota. The campaign committee reports that many persons have not yet contributed. Every cent given to the War Relief Fund goes to suffering people in Europe. Nothing is taken out by the local chapter or by National Headquarters for the expenses of the campaign. The ten million dollars asked of the entire country for War Relief is a minimum amount needed now. With 5,000,000 war refugees reported in Belgium, besides the other millions elsewhere, all that can be given is necessary to lessen in part the terrible deprivations and sufferings of these ravaged people.

The following telegram from Norman H. Davis, President of the National Red Cross was received this morning by Dr. C. Arthur Lincoln, Chairman of the Polk County Chapter:

"With several million men locked in mortal combat on French and Belgian soil, the relief needs of Belgium and French people are reaching staggering proportions. Already 5,000,000 pitiful refugees are clogging every road into central France trying to escape bombing and strafing from airplanes.
