Practical Sympathy

This morning the Red Cross War Relief Fund of Polk County amounted to \$1,254.48, within \$145.52 of double the quota.

Every cent of it is desperately needed. Wayne C. Taylor, American Red Cross delegate in charge of headquarters in Paris, states "Americans who lived in France during the World War and witnessed refugee scenes then say the present influx of refugees is much more appalling, and the end is not in sight. The needs of the 5,000,000 refugees fleeing from battle zones into southwestern France are appalling. All of the refugees are absolutely destitute, many are sick and wounded, many were forced to leave members of their families dead along the roadside in their flight. The impact on the food and other supplies of France is staggering. Resources here will
