## National War Relief Quota Doubled

It is \$1,400 now that Polk County is asked to contribute to the National War Relief Fund of \$20,000,000. Treasurer J. B. Hester of the local chapter of the Red Cross reports \$1,349.48 received to date, or within \$50.52 of double the original quota. President Norman H. Davis of the National Red Cross in a telegram received this morning says, "Impossible to describe pitiful plight of millions of refugees in France, sick, wounded, hungry, homeless. They cry to us for help. Chapters where possible should double their quota. In fact only limitation should be the maximum generosity of American people."
