Consolidate Routes

United States Rural Mail Tryon Route One and Mill Spring Route 3 will be consolidated on August 1 with Broadus B. Flynn taking both routes at a salary of \$2,320 per year. The government will save about \$1,200 a year as Carrier Edwin Wilson and Carrier Flynn are each receiving \$1,800 a year. The Route will be known as Tryon Route 1.
