Tax To Prevent Attacks

Taxes for the purpose of raising funds to pay for national defence will begin on July 1. Many luxuries will be affected. Adult admissions at the Tryon Theatre will be raised from 25c to 30c to take care of the federal tax on theatre admissions. The federal tax on cigarettes will be increased one-half cent on a package. All dealers will be required to take stock of their merchandise on their shelves and floors and make an accurate count to put on an official blank which they are to get from the collector of internal revenue. Each cigarette dealer should make immediate request for such blank in order to avoid severe penalties for failure to make prompt return.
