HEALTH REPORT

The Rutherford - Polk District Health Department has just completed and received reports on the horoscope clinic held in the Health Department office last week. During this clinic ninety-three people received fluoroscopic examination of the chest for tuberculosis. Some of these were old cases of tuberculosis brought in for reexamination. All of the others either had symptoms of tuberculosis or had been in contact with the disease. Seventy-seven were found to be negative to tuberculosis. One far advanced case, and nine early cases of tuberculosis were found.

During this clinic many were amined who had children or examined small brothers and sisters with childhood tuberculosis. These children were found with the disease by means of the X-ray clinics he'd during the past two years by the Health Department.
