Faculty Announced for Church Training School

Eleven different denominations were represented at the dinner held Friday night at Sunnysdale to approve and initiate new plans for the second year of the Inter-Church Teachers Training School. The Faculty for the Discussion Classes was announced as follows: For Beginners and Primary, Mrs. Mary Burts, Ph. D. of Limestone College and for years the outstanding director of those departments in the First Presbyterian church of Spartanburg. Juniors, Dr. C. Arthur Lincoln. Intermediates, Rev. R. A. Ellis of the First Baptist church, Landrum. Mr. Ellis has already achieved a reputation as a leader among the young people and was especially trained at college for this work. Young People, the Rev.
