Organize to Defend America

A mass meeting which filled the Parish House Friday night voted enthusiastically to organize a Polk County Chapter of the Committee to Defend America by Aiding the Allies. The following officers and committee chairmen were elected: W. E. Kilpin, chairman; Mrs. Houston Shockey, secretary; Dudley C. Smith, treasurer; Mrs. Harman Vanderhoef, chairman publicity committee; Miss Katherine Hamilton, chairman membership committee.

Franklin P. Shockey of Chicago spoke on the subject, "If Hitler Wins." Dr. C. Arthur Lincoln presided. Mrs. George H. Holmes, for a committee, put in nomination the names of the above officers and committee members.

It was suggested that every person send at once to his congressmen the following message, or one similar, by letter, telegram, or postcard: "As a citizen, I earnestly urge you to give all possible aid in assuring immediate dispatch, to Britain, of twenty-five Flying Fortresses, twenty torpedo boats, and as many combat and pursuit planes as possible." Names of senators from each state and of the representative from each congressional district can be secured from Mrs. Houston Shockey, secretary of the committee.
