Raleigh, Nov. 4.—Speeding again last month topped all reported convictions of moving traffic violations in North Carolina, the Highway Safety Division reported today.

Out of 1,728 persons found guilty on the streets and highways of the state during October, 526 were speedsters, 418 were operating motor vehicles with faulty equipment, and 354 for failure to have licenses.
