## Rogers On Governor's Inauguration Committee

Hon. Carroll P. Rogers, representative from Polk County in the State Legislature, received a telegram today from Governor-elect J. M. Broughton, calling him to Raleigh on Wednesday noon to serve on the joint Senate-House committee to make plans for Governor's inauguration ceremonies on January 9th at the state capitol in Raleigh. Mr. Broughton will succeed Governor Clyde R. Hoey on that date. The inauguration committee will consist of three members from the Senate and three from the House.
