RECORD ATTENDANCE AT SCOUT BOARD

Shelby, Feb. 19.—The Executive Board of the Piedmont Council, Boy Scouts of America, Inc., meeting at the private dining room of the Hotel Charles had its record attendance for the past 17 years with 84 members of the Board and their guests present. Representatives were in attendance from the Counties of Alexander, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Cleveland, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, McDowell and Rutherford. Hon. Clyde R. Hoey, former governor, elected as the vice-president of the Council from Cleveland County was presented to the group.

Reports received from the various counties of the Council show that steps have been taken to organize for an intensive development of Scouting and Cubbing for the year 1941 in keeping with the national program to invigorate and strengthen democracy thru a program of positive training such as the Boy Scout movement affords. Efforts will be made during the year to greatly enlarge the present enrollment of more than 3,000 Scouts and Cubs.

The Council voted to participate in the building of a suitable memorial to W. D. Boyce who was responsible for the Boy Scout movement coming to America more than 31 years ago. The memorial is being sponsored by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America and the leaders of Scouting in America have been
