Bronze Tablet In Memory Of William R. Mehaffey

A bronze tablet in memory of William R. Mehaffey, chairman of the Harmon Field commission from 1927 to 1937 will be placed soon on the gate post at the entrance of Harmon Field. tablet is now on display at Missildine's show window. The tablet was donated by a friend of Harmon Field in appreciation of Mr. Mehaffey's interest and service to the youth of the community. While secretary of the Tryon Chamber of Commerce Mr. Mehaffev conducted the correspondence with the Harmon Foundation and secured the initial donation that made Harmon Field possible as a community playground. With the cooperation of Mayor E. E. Missildine and former president of Chamber of Commerce, C. J. Lynch and other interested citizens the present field was purchased, improved and increased in size from time to time as money or credit was made available. After several years sufficient progress had been made to receive an additional award from the Harmon Foundation as a prize of achievement. Big hearted and modest, Mr. Mehaffey often paid money out of his own pecket to keep the field in condition. Some friends who knew of the condition contributed from time to time, but there were not enough of them. The load on his mind and heart became too heavy. There was still a big balance due on the original investment. The mortgage holders demanded payment. Then it Continued on Back Page
