The show had been put off a week later this year, and the advanced foilage and dogwood blossoms made the arena more beautiful than ever.

The spectators seemed to be having a better time than ever. All their wants were taken care of with better facilities. The lunch booths and drink stands were attractively decorated and operated by competent committees. The small children entertained themselves with the swings, seesaws, and sliding boards. It was a grand day.
