Hoey of Shelby, former governor of North Carolina. The speaker was introduced by the chairman of the Tryon School Board, Nelson Jackson, Jr. Diplomas were presented by the superintendent Major W. Schilletter. Others on the stage were the principal and acting superintendent M. B. Caldwell D. S. Blois and James Lankford of the School Board and the Rev. George M. Schreyer who gave the invocation.

The valedictory address by Miss Hope Schilletter and the salutatory by John Ralph Moore were examples of the high training and

good spirit existing in the school. Governor Hoey said that only about one-fourth of the high school graduates enter college but that whether they go to college or not there is opportunity for everyone to be what he wants to be. The same virtues of honesty, courage, etc., are needed Education should teach one how to live and how to make a living.
