## Organize Polk Cotton Recent Additions Stamp Committee

Formation of a Cotton Samp Committee for Polk County to coperate with the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the operation Supplementary Cotton Stamp Plan in this area in the relatively near future, was announced today by J. A. Wilson, county agricultural agent.

John Cowan was elected chairman of the committee. Other members representative of the Cotton Trades Industry of Polk County, included: B. L. Ballenger, Miss Ophelia Shields and Tryon Bank & Trust Company.

Mr. Wilson stated that the main purpose of crganizing the committee was to assist the government in helping to acquaint all retailers and wholesalers of cotton goods in the County with the manner in which they could cooperate and participate in the benefits of the program.

He added that on June 12th at 7:30 o'clock in the court house a mass meeting of all store operators and their clerks, handling cotton products would be held. In stressing the importance of attending this meeting, Mr. Wilson pointed out that merchants cannot accept Cotton Stamps for redemption by the government until they "Retailers" have completed a Statement" form entitling them to participate.
