A PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

State of North Carolina.

Whereas, North Carolina's great farm industry is closely allied with the dairy cow and her products; and

Whereas, scientists have long recognized the high nutritional value of milk and its products, to-wit: butter, cheese, ice cream, etc., and from youth to old age these goods occupy primary position in the diet of our people as nourishing, refreshing and appetizing and health building foods, and

Whereas, the consumption of milk in North Carolina is only .4 pint per capita per day, or approximately one-half of the national average; and

Whereas, today milk and dairy products are relatively cheap and offer the most valuable economical diet of the average family; and

Whereas, farmers, distributors, merchants and consumers are all vitally concerned and interested in this vast agricultural industry;

Now, Therefore, I, J. Melville Broughton, Governor of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim June as Dairy Month in this state and urge upon our entire citizenship more consideration of the importance of the dairy industry and of the nutritional value of milk and its products as wholesome, healthful, and strengthening foods for human consumption, and bring to the attention of the people of the state the immense
