## Calling All Aluminum!

Members of the Boy Scout organization and Boy's Club of Tryon will call at every home in Tryon on Thursday, July 24, to gather any aluminum which can be spared. This is an opportunity for every family to contribute to the National Defense Program in an effective way. All aluminum is to be used exclusively for national defense and will be sent directly to the smelters where all by-products will be used.

Pots, pans, kettles, bottle tops, refrigerator plates, toys, screening, double-boilers—anything that is made of aluminum will do. The purpose of the campaign is to supplement the vast supplies of the metal which is vital to production of defense equipment, especially of fighting planes.

Mayor John R. Burgess of Columbus and Mayor Roy R. Baisden of Saluda have been appointed to head the aluminum drive in their respective towns. Grover Feagan, chairman of the County Board of Commissioners, has been appointed to head the drive in the remainder of Polk County. Mayor E. E. Missildine heads the drive in Tryon.
