Town and County Officers Made Raid In Colored Section

Chief of Police Claude Scoggins, and Patrolman Donell Flynn of Tryon police force, Sheriff W. D. Hines and Deputy Foster made a raid Saturday night in the colored section of Tryon. Two men were arrested and charged with non-tax-paid whiskey. They were Jesse Ziegler and Alf Payne. At the home of Ziegler the officers stated a quantity of whiskey was taken along with five 10-gallon kegs, four 5-gallon kegs, 20 gallon jugs; a score or more quart bottles, two or three bushels of pint bottles. The officers stated the containers had had whiskey in them. Payne was caught running away from his home by raiding officers with two gallons of whiskey. The two men were released on bond after being taken to the County jail at Columbus.
