## Polk Superior Court Opens August 18th In Columbus

Monday week, August 18th, is the beginning of Court Week in Columbus. Resident Judge Don Phillips of Rockingham will preside and Solicitor C. O. Ridings of Forest City will represent the State. Clerk of Court R. S. McFarland's records show that there will be for trial one case of burglary, one for murder, 11 for assault with deadly weapon; arson 1; 23 for violation of prohibition laws; 19 for driving while drunk; 2 for harboring criminal; one for operating disorderly house; violating forest fire laws 1; disposing of mortgage property 1; embezzlement 1; forcible trespassing 6; larceny 4; breaking and entering 5; highway robbery 1; reckless driving 2; affray 3; abandonment and non-support 1.

The jury list was published several weeks ago.
