The Asheville Citizen this morning has in big headlines "Shelby Capitalist Buys 14-story Jackson Building" and along side a picture of the building is one of Fred W. Blanton, the new owner, a past president of the Tryon Kiwanis Club and former president of the Polk County Bank & Trust Co. Mr. Blanton, who is also president of the M. & J.
