pation in the military defense program.

(b) Maintenance of National morale and efficiency. These functions may be described as maintaining the second line of defense. Land-use planning, production of essential food and feed crops, nutrition programs, public assistance, recreation, protection of water supplies, sanitation, hospitalization, rehabilitation, conservation of human resources, industrial production, are but a few of the things to which the Councils may direct their attention.

(c) Preparations for adequate protection of the civilian population in periods of emergency, arising out of the primary defense program, from catastrophe, or from enemy attacks.

Some of these activities call for immediate attention; others can be deferred for a time while others still may be studied and planned for as possible. One of the most important functions of the Local Defense Councils will be to analyze local conditions and determine the relative urgency or action.
