BRITISH PRISONERS OF WAR

The British War Relief Society has made arrangements with the International Red Cross to have parcels of food delivered to the British soldiers now in German prison camps. A donation of \$2.40 will supply one parcel of food containing a week's supply of nutritious foods that provide the vitamins essential to health. Each parcel, under the supervision of the International Red Cross, is routed from Lisbon into the camps themselves and each prisoner receives the rations consigned to him. **NOT ONE SINGLE PARCEL FALLS INTO THE HANDS OF THE GERMANS.**

Your donation will bring new health and new spirit to these prisoners who are subsisting on a meagre diet that threatens malnutrition. The prisoner's ration from the German government's remains just the same no matter what comes to him from outside, thus Germany does not save an ounce of food in its feeding of prisoners.
