"No longer any restrictions on sale of 6 or 8 ply tires of size 700x20 or less to persons who can qualify. Also obsolete type new tires may be purchased by anyone who agrees to install tires at once and trade in their old ones, and who can show the need for them to the tire rationing board.

"The new February quotas were received: Passenger tires, 6; passenger tubes 5; truck tires 17; truck tubes 28."
