Tryon to be Bird Sanctuary

At a recent meeting of the Try-DGarden club it was voted that s be taken toward making Tryon a bird sanctuary. Accordingly a petition was sent to the Mayor and the Council, and at this meeting on Monday the following resolution was passed:

RESOLUTION

Whereas it is desirable to make the town of Tryon a bird sanctuary, and this Council has been asked to lend its support to the same;

Now therefore, be it resolved:—
1. That the entire municipal area of Tryon be declared a bird

sanctuary.

2. That within the town limits it shall be illegal to kill any wild bird except hawks blue jays and starlings, or to destroy any bird's

nest.
3. That permission be granted to the members of the N. C. Bird and to put up artistic signs at points where highways enter Tryon, indicating that Tryon is abird sanctuary, such signs to be subject to the approval of this Council.

4. That violations of the prohibition of this ordinance shall be punishable by fine of not less

than \$10.00

This will be a satisfaction to all bird lovers, and there are many in Tryon. Already we have more than a beginning for a Bird Club that cculd be affliated with the State Club. Feeding the birds is almost a leading activity in Tryon; many of the Garden Club members are also members of the N. C. Bird Club. This year particularly we want to be prepared Continued on Back Page
