The American Women's Hospitals conducts all over the county pre-natal and post-natal clinics for mothers unable to afford private medical and nursing attention. It also holds venereal disease clinics. Its work supplements that of the County Public Health Department. The county, through tax resources, cannot carry on the work of these two vitally needed organizations; and, without their assistance, real and extensive suffering would ensue.
