## St. Lukes Hospital

The members of the Board of Trustees of St. Luke's Hospital desire to put on record an expression of deep regret that ill health has made necessary the resignation of Miss Edna Calvert, who, for the past six years, has been Superintendent of the Hospital.

During this period, Miss Calvert has not only efficiently managed the Hospital but also has exerted in this community a very real influence. By her signal service to this institution, by her interest in every good cause and worthy enterprise and by her unswerving loyalty to the Hospital, Miss Calvert has won and held the respect and esteem of all who have known her.

Within the Hospital itself, the Superintendent has had the loyalty and affection of all the workers. Notable in her management of the hospital, during these six years, has been her ability, with very slight change, to hold together the personnel of the nursing staff. Such continuity has made a real contribution to the good work done at the Hospital.

During Miss Calvert's administration, the general condition of the Hospital has been greatly improved. Among other things, the old second-hand X ray equipment has been replaced by a new machine of the latest type and the old floors which were unsatisfactory have been replaced, throughout the main hall and rooms, with battle ship linoleum. Also, while Miss Calvert has been Superintendent, a Nurses' Home has been given, thus releasing in the main Hospital building valuable space
