No Sugar After Tonight!

Applicants for sugar rationing books today were cautioned by Dudley C. Smith, chairman of the Polk County rationing board, to prepared with full informathe when they register at elementary schools in their vicinity May 4, 5, 6, 7.

Stores, institutional and industrial users of sugar will register April 28th and 29th at schools in their communities between the hours of 10 a. m., and 5 p. m. They will be required to file detailed records for two years. In the meantime, they will not be permitted to make any sugar sales after April 28th, except upon surrender of sugar cer-Hence, retail sugar tificates. sales will be suspended for a brief period.

Only one member of each family may register for the family unit, but he or she must have with them data regarding the other members of the family. s will not be issued until all data are furnished, it was

made clear.

Here is the information which should be furnished at the time of registration:

1. A list of the members of the family and their exact names.

2. An exact description of each family member of the height, weight, color of eyes, color of hair, age and sex.

3. The exact relationship of each member of the family unit to the person who is registering

for the family unit.

4. It is necessary to know to the pound just how much sugar is in possession of the household. --- Continued in Back Page
