G. C. Feagan Makes Statement

My friends have urged that I place before the public the ideals which I have strongly supported and a few of the things which I have done, first, as a citizen and later as a citizen and member of the Polk County Board of Commissioners to improve public interest in our County. Since childhood I have lived in Polk Co. and upon reaching maturity I became affiliated with the Democratic Party. As a member and representative of the party I have made every effort to see that the interests of the entire population of Polk County were best served. To the party members I wish to say that I have always voted a Democratic ticket and I will continue to do so.

Better educational opportunities for our children have always been one of my chief interests. As a member of the Polk County School Board from 1926 to 1928, I was instrumental in the construction of the Sunny View school building, and a large portion of the Stearns building in Columbus. During this period many improvements to the other white and colored school buildings throughout the County were made.

For almost twelve years I have served as chairman of the Polk County Board of Commissioners. During this period an adequate school building was built at Mill Spring. Unfortunately this building was destroyed by fire, but has now been replaced by a completely modern school building. The financing of the new building was

PLEASE REGISTER ON MONDAY FOR SUGAR !

Instructions for sugar registration for individuals of Tryon, Lynn, Saluda and vicinity.

Hours for registration: For Tryon, Lynn and Saluda:

Monday, May 4th, 9 a. m., to 5 p. m.; Tuesday, May 5th, 3 p. m. to 5 p. m.; Wednesday, May 6th, 3 p. m., to 5 p. m.; Thursday, May 7th, 3 p. m., to 5 p. m.

Everyone, white and colored are urged to register on Monday, May 4th, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 5 p. m. The schools have been asked to take care of the registration and this cannot be done for four consecutive days without seriously interfering with school work. One whole day, Monday, has been set aside by the Tryon white, Tryon colored, Lynn school, and the Saluda school to take care of the bulk of the population.

On Monday around 25 registrars will be on hand at the Tryon school to take care of the 4,000 people expected to register. In Tryon on the other days, only a few registrars will be available. If you do not want to wait in line, please come on Monday to either the Tryon white, Tryon colored, Lynn, or Saluda school whichever school district you are in.
