FARMERS! Important Winter Corn Tour May 21st

Are you interested in a crop which will grow in the winter time to take the place of corn? Barley is called winter corn. Many using barley in the place of arn.

A trip to study barley experiments at Statesville Experiment Station is being planned for May 21st. As much as 85 bushels per acre is being grown there with some of the new varieties.

Experimental work with new varieties of wheat and oats will be studied. If you have not been to see this extensive work in small grain you should not miss this tour.

Dr. G. K. Middleton, who is in charge of this work will explain the different plots; varieties and treatment. You will see things you never thought existed in the small grain field.

Last year two or three carloads went from Polk County and five or six ordered some of the leading strains of oats and barley. One mer has thirty acres of the new arded Barley sown this year and another has six bushels of each.

Farmers who wish to make the trip should get in a reservation at once with the County Agent. Two or three cars may be available if farmers chip in on expenses. The first to come will be the ones who will get the seats in the cars. The party will leave the courthouse at 10 o'clock Thursday morning, May 21. Don't wait or you will be too late.
