Weather for Monday: High 58; low 33; rain 1.65. . . North Carolinians are prohibited from selling tires no matter how worn they may be to any person or firm except the U. S. Government. Both buyer and seller will be prosecuted . . . The surprise blackout may come at any moment and the State Office of Civilian Defense urges every family to buy blackout curtains in homes where there are open fire places. The unconcealed glow of an open fire may be visible to an enemy pilot high in the sky, it was pointed out . . . There is no telling how many Joneses in this war. There are 53,200 Johnstons, 2,000 of them named William; 51,900 Smiths with 3,412 of them named William; 48,000 Browns. There are hundreds of soldiers named John Jones with wives named Mary; so that's one of the reasons the Army has to have a serial number, for a name doesn't mean much in locating a fellow. Col. John H. Bush of the Fourth Service Command, says when you think of a soldier's name also think of his serial number. Otherwise he might not get his mail and you might not get your allotment. SIXTH REGISTRATION, SELECTIVE SERVICE

Please take note! The sixth registration for men who have attained their 18th birthday since June 30, 1942, will be held at the office of Polk County Local Board No. 1, over Jackson's Store, between the hours of 9 a. m., and 5 p. m., as follows:

1. Those who were born on or after July 1, 1924, but not after August 31, 1924, shall be registered on any day during the week commencing Friday, December 11, 1942, and ending Thursday, Dec. 17, 1942.

2. Those who were born on or after September 1, 1924, but not after October 31, 1924, shall be registered on any day during the week commencing Friday, Dec. 18, 1942, and ending Thursday, Dec. 24, 1942.

3. Those who were born on or after November 1, 1924, but not after December 31, 1924, shall be registered on any day during the period commencing Saturday, December 26, 1942, and ending Thursday, December 31, 1942.

Men who attain their 18th birthday on or after January 1, 1943, are required to register at the Local Board office on their 18th birthday. Failure to register is punishable by fine or imprisonment or both.
