Father of Charles Cox Murdered At Switzer, S. C.

Walter Cox, 60, father of Charles Cox of Tryon, was found early Wednesday morning in a combination filling station and store at Switzer, S. C. His head had been crushed with a blunt instrument, and officers believe robbery was the motive as small change was scattered and his money box missing. The murder is thought to have taken place about dawn soon after Mr. Cox had opened his store. He was filling a sack of apples from a basket when struck. Officers are searching for the assailant. The tragedy was discovered by a bread truck driver shortly after 7 a. m.

Funeral services will be held this afternoon (Thursday) at 3 o'clock at the home which is about one-fourth mile from the store.

Besides his son, Charles Cox, of Tryon, the deceased is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ella Hughes Woodruff, of Lyman, S. C. and a daughter, Mrs. H. L. Woodruff, of Lyman, S. C.
