## Tryon District Schools to Open September 1st

The Tryon District Schools, composed of Tryon, Lynn, and one Negro school, will open on Wednesday, September 1st, for the 1943-44 session. Due to the smaller allotment of white teachers, Lynn will operate only the First, Second and Third grades, with the pupils in the other grades transferring to the Tryon school.

The Tryon high school will offer a course in physics in compliance with the war program, urging schools to give physics, chemistry, and mathematics for pre-induction training. The physics course will emphasize electricity, radio, aerodynamics, navigation and meteorology.

The business course will again offer typing, bookkeeping, and shorthand. All commercial students are urged to take bookkeeping and shorthand along with typing. At present an insufficient number have registered for bookkeeping and shorthand and pupils are urged to consider the need for these important subjects. These subjects will not have any commercial fees.

Students, with the exception of first grade pupils, are asked to register at the superintendent's office on Tuesday, August 31st, from 10 to 12 noon, for classification. First grade pupils are required by North Carolina state law to be Schick tested for diphtheria and are also requested to take the smallpox vaccination. This can be taken care of by your family physician or the county
