Wall, one of Tryon's High School star athletes, left school right af-ter Pearl Harbor and joined the Marines as quickly as he could. He was accepted on Dec. 16th and was one of the first Marines in the invasion of Guadalcanal in the Southwest Pacific. This is his first furlough home since 1941. He has been wounded twice and has been decorated with the Purple Heart and honored for gallantry in action in defense of his country.
