President Franklin D. Roosevelt died unexpectedly at his Warm Springs, Ga. home on Thursday at 4:35 p. m. of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Church bells in Tryon will toll Saturday morning at 10:25, five minutes before the community service at the Theatre. The stores on Trade street will close for one hour during the memorial service. Boy Scouts will blow taps during the actual funeral period in Washington. Mr. Ressevelt was the honorary president of the Boy Scouts of America.
