Weather Tuesday: High 82, low 65, rain .39 . . . President Truman suggests that the Speaker of the House be named to succeed to the Presidency in the event of the death of the President and Vice-President; then the president pro tempore of the senate, before continuing the line of succession to the secretary of state and other cabinet members in order of their creation. Suggestion approved by Republicans and Democrats. Five billion dollars in securities stolen by Germans found by American soldiers. Progress continues against the Japs in the Pacific . . . Boy Scouts in Polk County have an opportunity to advance each Friday night at the Scout Camp. ## Gov. Requests Continuance Of Civilian Defense Office

Governor R. Gregg Cherry has written Polk County Chairman Charles J. Lynch thanking him and all the members of his committee for the splendid work done by the Civilian Defense Council.

The Governor writes, "Also, I take this opportunity to request you to remain in your present capacity in Civilian Defense, with your organization of volunteers remaining intact, to handle any services which your group may render in prosecuting the war against Japan to the utmost. Please do not consider your OCD responsibilities ended until Japan is defeated and you have been notified that your appointment has terminated. Your State Director R. L. McMillan, graciously has agreed to continue on a voluntary basis in his present capacity for such further service and information as may be needed from and on the State level after June 30th which also is the termination of the National Office of Civilian Defense."

Chairman Lynch was originally appointed by Governor Broughton.
