

## Social Security Representative Here Monday, August 6th

A representative of the Asheville field office of the Social Security Board will be at the Tryon town hall on Monday, Aug. 6, at 2:30 p. m.

Wage earners who have worked in a job covered by the Social Security Act since Dec. 31, 1936, and have attained age 65, may be eligible to file claim for themselves, their wives, or minor children, whether they have an account number or not. Surviving relatives of deceased workers, such as widows, children, or parents, or if none of the above, persons who have paid funeral expenses, may be eligible to file claim.

In addition, persons who have need of social security account numbers or other information pertaining to the Act are invited to meet this representative at the time and place mentioned.
