Dr. Jockinsen is a graduate of Lawrence College, Columbia University, and Union Theological Seminary. He was a Chaplain in Seminary. He was a Chapian in World War No. 1, then served as pastor of the Pilgrim Congregational church, Lansing, Mich., for six years, and in 1925 went to Manhattan, Kansas, as pastor of an influential college church for six years.
