FARMERS FEDERATION TO REBUILD PLANT HERE

President James G. K. McClure and General Manager Guy Sales of Asheville were in Tryon Monday making plans for the rebuilding of the Polk County Warehouse of the Farmers Federation which was destroyed by fire early Sunday morning. The freezer locker plant which was nearing completion was also destroyed.

President McClure was high in his praise of the Tryon Volunteer Fire Department, which responded so wonderfully at 5 o'clock in the morning. The cause of the fire is still undetermined. The damage to stock, building and freezer locker equipment and otherwise has been estimated at from \$35,000 to \$50,000. Most of the loss is covered by insurance.

General Manager Sales stated Monday that contractors expected to have the new building erected within 60 to 90 days.

A meeting of the Polk County Committee of the Federation will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock to discuss plans for the future. The work of rebuilding the freezer locker plant will also go forward just as soon as materials and equipment can be brought in.
