When buying nuts in their shell, homemakers sometimes are uncertain as to how much "meat" they will yield. This yardstick will help eliminate guess work: One pound of unshelled almonds yields about 1 cup of shelled kernels; 1 pound of filberts, about 1 1-3 cups; 1 pound of peanuts, about 2 cups; 1 pound of pecans, almost 1 1/2 cups; 1 pound of English walnuts, a little more than 1 1/2 cups halved kernels; and 1 pound of black walnuts, about one-half cup broken kernels.
