Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the Erskine Memorial Congregational church with the Rev. Frank W. Murtfeldt, pastor, officiating, assisted by the Rev. C. P. Burnett. Interment was in Tryon cemetery beside her husband, the late John Orr, former Tryon merchant, builder and civic leader.

The deceased is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Otis West, of Charleston, S. C., and one sister, Mrs. W. E. Parsons, of Tryon.
