ing his ministry to adjoining counties, and to new fields in Polk,—in 1886, he reported that a "log church for colored people had been built near Tryon."

The name of Milnor Jones disappeared from the Diocesan records of North Carolina after 1890, when he removed with his family to Oregon. One daughter, however, married J. C. Camp, and continued to reside in Polk County, where she has descendants among its present day citizens.—(To Be Continued.)
