"Fiddlin" John Weaver Died This Morning

John D. Weaver, 74, affectionately known to thousands of friends as "Fiddlin John", because of his popularity as a fiddler, died suddenly this morning at 9 o'clock at his home on Landrum Route 1, Polk County.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 3 p. m., at Green Creek Baptist Church, conducted by Rev. Harold Brown and Rev. N. A. Melton.

He is survived by his two sons, Glenn and Joe Weaver of Spartanburg and three daughters, Mrs. Ben Fulbright of Campobello, S. C., Mrs. Ira White of Spartanburg and Mrs. C. D. Waldrop of Route 1, Landrum, S. C. Also one brother, S. B. Weaver of Campobello.

Mr. Weaver was a Mason, member of the Jeff L. Nelson Lodge at Tryon, and a life long resident of Polk County. He was a prominent farmer of Green Creek section. His hobby was fiddling and he was a well known figure at Farmers Federation meetings, fiddling conventions, and at district and national folk festivals where radio broadcasts and records were made of his music.
