MISS GREENE WINS ORATORICAL CONTEST

Miss Lavinia Greene was awarded the Bar Association medal in the oratorical contest on World Peace at the High School assembly at the Tryon school Wednesday.

The medal was presented by Ryan McCown, who has directed the local contest. All the American history and civics students participated in this contest, writing essays on the subject, "Is World Government the Way to World Peace?" From these essays judges selected the six best. Other judges then selected the two best from these six. The winners, Lavinia Greene and Garland Goodwin, delivered their arguments before the Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs.
