Weather Thursday: High 82, low 52, humidity 47 . . . Russia fights General Marshall's plan to aid Europe and makes Checkoslovakia change plan to attend conference. Russia and small countries near her are opposed to the United States and the rest of Europe . . . State Board of Education adopts 59 million dollars budget and teachers will get 20 per cent increase in salaries . . . Congress passes bill of succession to president. In case both the president and vice-president should die the next in line would be the speaker of the house; next presiding officer of the senate; and then the cabinet officers as formerly beginning with the secretary of state . . . Gordon Gibbs of Mill Spring presented President Truman a hand-made table with a top containing a colored map of the United States made of inlaid wood of 51 different species. Senators Hoey, Umstead and Congressman Cooley, went to the White House with him. Photographers made pictures of the group with President Truman pointing to Missouri on the map.
