I had rather catch a bass and bream than crappie for they put up more of a fight. When a crappie strikes and you hook him the fight is over. Not so with the little old bream. He will zigzag and take the lure for a ride. Lake Adger is one of the few artificial lakes in the mountains of Western North Carolina that is not crowded with summer homes. The lake and dam is there and plenty of fish, if you can catch them. The water was murky on Thursday and the fish were striking slowly. Maybe that's why I hooked only 2 small-fry crappie.
