MRS. LOUIS FULDNER

Mrs. Amanda Blum Fuldner, 67, widow of Dr. Louis Fuldner died Thursday at a nursing home in Asheville.

A simple funeral service will be held Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the McFarland Funeral Home with Dr. George Farrand Taylor officiating. The body will be sent to Macon, Ga., for cremation.

Mrs. Fuldner is survived by two sons, Alexander Bollman of Vermont, and John G. Fuldner of Berlin, Germany; a half-sister, Mrs. Hedwig Hitzel of Tryon and several grandchildren.

Mrs. Fuldner was a native of Graz, Austria. She came to Tryon in 1921 with Dr. Fuldner soon after her retirement from the American stage where she was prominent as an understudy of the great Mrs. Minnie Madden Fiske in New York. Prior to that she prominent in the German was Theatre. Mrs. Fuldner came from an accomplished theatrical family. her mother, Alexandria Human, who died about 15 years ago in Tryon, appeared with the noted composer, Franz Liszt, before command performances at the Russian Court of Czar Alexander.

In addition to her theatrical talents, Mrs. Fuldner was a fine painter and instructor. She tutored a large number of young people in dramatics and took an interest in civic affairs, especially the Drama Fortnightly and Garden Club plays.

The Fuldner home was always a center of good cheer and fellowship for those who loved good company, the theatre, art and travel.
